

Creating job opportunities in Tuscaloosa

Epsilon Industries, a Canadian manufacturer of modular construction systems, plans to open a production facility in Tuscaloosa, creating 180 new jobs. The total investment is expected to reach \$3 million and will be in an existing building in the Tuscaloosa County Airport Industrial Park, to produce prefabricated modular utility systems. The project is expected to create 180 jobs for numerous positions that include boilermakers, pipefitters, pipe welders, structural welders, electricians, mechanical and electrical engineers, and general laborers. "Epsilon Industries is a welcome addition to Alabama's business community, and I look forward to seeing how the company's investment project positively impacts Tuscaloosa's economy," said Greg Canfield, Secretary of the Alabama Department of Commerce. Furthermore, Tuscaloosa Mayor Walt Maddox said that the addition of Epsilon Industries to Tuscaloosa's thriving manufacturing ecosystem will provide new high paying jobs and opportunities for hundreds of his citizens."


Contributing to the evolving auto industry

Li-Cycle, an industry leader in lithium-ion battery resource recovery and the leading lithium-ion battery recycler in North America, has started commercial operations at its Alabama Spoke location in Tuscaloosa. The 100,000 square foot facility (with an additional approximately 120,000 square feet in warehousing capacity) has created 45 new jobs. The strategically located facility enhances the Toronto firm's ability to support the recycling needs of the company's growing battery supply customer base in the southeastern U.S. region. Li-Cycle is creating an essential domestic supply of recycled material to support EV production and assist automakers in meeting their domestic production content requirements. The development of the EV supply chain in the region continues to accelerate as battery and automotive manufacturers establish operations. This growth is expected to continue to produce a significant amount of battery production scrap and end-of life batteries that will require recycling. "Li-Cycle's new battery recycling facility in Tuscaloosa adds a dynamic new dimension to Alabama's evolving auto industry," Alabama Governor Kay Ivey said. "This facility will play an important role in the lifecycle of batteries powering electric vehicles by contributing an innovative sustainability solution."
