

Building the railway of the 21st century

Canadian National Railway Company (CN) is investing \$25 million in Louisiana in 2022, for company-wide decarbonization initiatives and upgrading technology, capacity, rolling stock units and infrastructure. These investments will power sustainable growth and ensure the continued safe movement of goods in Louisiana and everywhere on CN's transcontinental network.

"CN is an integral part of the transportation system here in Louisiana, safely and reliably serving New Orleans and our industrial corridor on the Mississippi River," said Louisiana Governor John Bel Edwards.

CN is a major stakeholder in the ongoing success of the Port of New Orleans, helping link the Gulf of Mexico to towns across North America. CN operates major yards in Baton Rouge, Geismar, and Mays Yard. CN and the Port of New Orleans are developing more efficient supply chains and drawing more container traffic through the port to North American markets.

Teal Jones Group begins sawmill construction


Governor John Bel Edwards announced the start of construction on a \$110 million lumber production facility that will support the creation of nearly 500 new jobs in northwest Louisiana. Canada-based forestry products company **Teal Jones Group** will be constructing the southern yellow pine lumber plant.

"This project will stimulate economic activity, create good jobs in Louisiana's Northwest Region and contribute to the revitalization of our state's rural communities. It is a powerful reaffirmation of the important role our state's agribusiness sector plays in the growth and diversification of Louisiana's economy," Gov. Edwards said.

Canada invests in Louisiana

Trade with Canada supports **102,900 employees in Louisiana** in addition to the **7,800 employees** at Canadian-owned businesses across the state. In addition, Louisiana exports \$6.1 billion in goods and services to Canada.

Canadian-owned companies, including **Circle K**, **Waste Connections**, **Tsg Resources** and **Popeyes Louisiana Kitchen**, are major contributors to Louisiana's economy. They employ residents in every sector and contribute to the local economy with salary dollars, paying local taxes, and the purchase of goods and services in their supply chain.
