Powering new possibilities through wind

Wind power is a growing industry in North America, adding jobs to communities in both Canada and the United States. Wind turbines, or towers, collect and convert the kinetic energy that wind produces into electricity, which is then sent through transmission and distribution lines to help power the energy grid. With a manufacturing plant in Brandon, South Dakota, Québec-based **Marmen** is one of the largest manufacturers of these wind towers in North America. **Marmen Energy**'s plant in Brandon, which employs more than 200 South Dakotans, recently marked its tenth year of operation.



Feeding fish in novel ways

Prairie AquaTech has invested nearly \$100 million in product development, testing, and construction of a 30,000-ton per year protein ingredient production facility in Brookings, South Dakota. The company produces high-quality, digestible plant-based protein ingredients from oilseed crops of both U.S. and Canadian origin. These products help extend the use of traditional marine-derived protein ingredients, such as fishmeal, which are in increasingly short supply, and they help reduce phosphorus discharge, which will improve the quality of shared North American waters. Prairie AquaTech's research and development bring significant benefits to both crop and aquaculture farmers in Canada and across North America.

A partner to firefighters

Rosenbauer America was founded in 1982 in Lyons, South Dakota to build firefighting and emergency vehicles for fire departments across the Midwest. Now the largest fire truck apparatus and emergency response vehicle manufacturer in the world, Rosenbauer ships almost 100 trucks per year to fire stations across Canada. A registered manufacturer with Transport Canada, Rosenbauer benefits from the integrated North American marketplace by sourcing parts from Canadian suppliers.
