

## Making the precious, sophisticated

Montréal's 5N Plus Inc. – a world leader in specialty semiconductors and performance materials – announced an exciting new agreement with global mining firm **Rio** Tinto. The partnership commits 5N Plus to refining tellurium produced at Rio Tinto's Kennecott copper operation outside of Salt Lake City for assembly into multiple specialty products, ranging from renewable energy to medical devices.

The Kennecott-mined tellurium will primarily be used in the manufacture of thin-film photovoltaic (PV) solar panels by Arizona-based First Solar. 5N Plus will also use the critical mineral at its St. George plant to produce ultra-high purity semiconductor substrates to serve the security and medical imaging markets.

## Take the scenic route


Famous for romantic routes that wind across Western Canada's breathtaking landscapes, the **Rocky**

## Canada invests in Utah

Trade with Canada supports 80,300 Utah jobs in addition to the 3,950 employees at Canadian-owned businesses across the state. In addition, Utah exports \$2.3 billion in goods and services to Canada.

Canadian-owned companies, including **Enbridge**, **Ovivo**, and **Osisko Development**, are major contributors to Utah's economy, employing residents in every sector of the economy, paying taxes locally and contributing to the local economy through these salary dollars.
