

Cascades in Ashland

In May 2023, Cascades produced its first roll of containerboard at its Bear Island, Virginia mill. The new machine produces high-quality, lightweight, 100% recycled linerboard and medium (fluting paper) for the North American market. The new line of Cascades XP linerboard manufactured in Bear Island will provide a full range of lighter weight grades to complement Cascades' current line of regular and heavyweight grades. Made from 100% recycled fiber, these new containerboard grades will provide the same consistency and reliability for high-speed quality converting.



Canada invests in Virginia

Trade with Canada supports 212,100 employees in Virginia in addition to the 15,500 employees at Canadian-owned businesses across the commonwealth. In addition, Virginia exports \$5.5 billion in goods and services to Canada.

Canadian-owned companies, including AltaGas, CAE, Corix Group of Companies, Furniture and Décor, High-Liner Foods, Info-Tech Research Group, Nature's Touch, Nutrien AG Solutions, Polycap LLC, Stantec and **Unilock**, are major contributors to Virginia's economy. They employ residents in every sector and contribute to the local economy with salary dollars, paying local taxes, and the purchase of goods and services in their supply chain.
